The Bogotá– Belém Declaration



Advancing Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) for Climate Justice

Launched: November 7, 2025 – Bogotá, Colombia

Occasion: *International Conference on Family Planning (ICFP) 2025*

Post-Conference Event: “From Bogotá to Belém: SRHR as a Catalyst for Climate Justice”

Preamble

We, the participants of the ICFP2025 Post-Conference Event “From Bogotá to Belém: SRHR as a Catalyst for Climate Justice” — SRHR advocates, climate negotiators, youth leaders, Indigenous voices, disability allies, civil society, researchers, and policymakers — united in Bogotá on the eve of COP30, issue this Declaration with urgency and resolve.

As the climate crisis deepens, it disproportionately impacts those already marginalized — especially women, girls, youth, persons with disabilities, and Indigenous communities.

Climate justice cannot be achieved without recognizing sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR) as essential to human dignity, resilience, and environmental sustainability.

Shared Commitments

- SRHR is a foundational component of climate resilience and gender equity.
- Integrating SRHR into climate policies, financing, and adaptation efforts strengthens community-led solutions and improves health outcomes.
- Youth, Indigenous, and feminist voices must lead and shape climate responses.
- Cross-sectoral collaboration is essential to move from fragmentation to transformative action.

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We Call on COP30 Delegates and Decision-Makers to:

1. Strengthen Gender-Responsive and Inclusive Climate Action

- Adopt an ambitious, robust, and intersectional Gender Action Plan (GAP) that integrates unpaid care work, SRHR, gender-based violence (GBV), and the critical work of women human rights defenders.
These elements must be preserved, strengthened, and adequately resourced to ensure the GAP reflects lived realities and promotes equality.
- Approve the inclusion of SRHR within the Gender Action Plan.

2. Embed SRHR within Climate Adaptation Frameworks

- Fully operationalize the Global Goal on Adaptation (GGA) with fit-for-purpose indicators for physical health, SRHR, mental health, and means of implementation, while addressing cross-cutting issues such as gender, disability, ageing, and children’s wellbeing.
- Include SRHR as a core resilience strategy within the Global Goal on Adaptation, and across nationally determined contributions (NDCs), national adaptation plans (NAPs), and health national adaptation plans (HNAPs).

3. Ensure Equitable and Accessible Climate Financing

- Adequately fund the Loss and Damage Fund, the Adaptation Fund, and the Least Developed Countries Fund (LDCF) with non-debt-exacerbating capital for low- and middle-income countries.
- Integrate SRHR into climate finance proposals submitted to the Green Climate Fund, Adaptation Fund, and other global and regional mechanisms to ensure health, gender, and rights co-benefits are visible, measurable, and fundable.

4. Advance Inclusive Climate Governance

- Ensure meaningful participation of youth, Indigenous peoples, persons with disabilities, stateless persons, and SRHR advocates in climate governance and decision-making at all levels.
- Fund evidence generation and data systems that track the gendered and intersectional health impacts of climate change, ensuring data are disaggregated by gender, age, and disability as a minimum standard.

5. Uphold Human Rights and Accelerate Climate Ambition

- Uphold human rights frameworks in all climate mitigation and adaptation policies, ensuring accountability, transparency, and inclusivity.
- Ensure the rapid reduction of greenhouse gas emissions to limit global

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warming to 1.5°C or less, to reduce the disproportionate health and social burdens borne by women, girls, and marginalized communities.

As SRHR and Climate Advocates, We Pledge to:

- Strengthen regional and global advocacy linking SRHR and climate justice.
- Collaborate across movements to co-develop integrated, inclusive policies and solutions.
- Mobilize youth, Indigenous, and disability leadership, and amplify community voices to ensure meaningful participation of all groups.
- Track commitments and share evidence leading into COP30 and beyond — ensuring accountability for action.


Together — from Bogotá to Belém — we commit to ensuring that **climate action includes, respects, and advances sexual and reproductive health and rights for all.**
